8. The same yarn as the warp for tabby weft, about 700 yards (3 ounces). Contrasting color 3/2 cotton for pattern weft, about 300 yards (4 ounces).
9. Four other fat yarns, Harrisville Highland weight or thicker (cheap acrylic knitting yarn is fine), 1-2 ounces of each. Ideally the yarns are varying values of the same hue, for example: dark red, medium red, pink, white; or dark purple, medium purple, light purple, white.
10. Other colors of 10/2, 5/2 and 3/2 cotton to play with. Bring what you have. The Leader will have some on hand for trying out.
